

- **Spread Awareness:** Join the Social Media Committee to share facts, bust myths, and promote HPV vaccination through peer-driven campaigns




- **Educate and Advocate:** Join the Public Health & Advocacy Committee to educate communities, develop plans, and mobilize youth to advocate for HPV vaccination.




- **Deliver Impactful Presentations:** Work with the Outreach Committee to create and share advocational material

January is Cervical Cancer Awareness Month
Protect yourself: Get a screening
Cervical cancer screenings may include Pap tests, testing for a virus called human papillomavirus (HPV), or both. In both tests, cells are taken from the cervix and sent to the lab for testing:
• A Pap test looks for abnormal cells.
• An HPV test looks for infection with the types of HPV that are linked to cervical cancer.
• WHO recommends the HPV DNA test as the primary screening test, starting at age 30, with a regular screening every 5 to 10 years as a part of the screen-and-treat approach.
